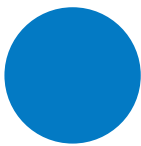

YOUTH FUTURES CREATIVE COMPETITION

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following terms and conditions are outlined on behalf of the National Youth Commission, host of the Youth Futures Summit, as required for any entrant into the WhyNot?/Youth Futures Summit competition.

1. This competition is open to 18-29-year-olds living in Australia.
2. All information detailing how to enter forms part of these terms and conditions. It is a condition of entry that all rules are accepted as final and that the competitor agrees to abide by these rules.
Submission of an entry will be taken to mean acceptance of these terms and conditions.
3. Entries must be submitted through the online form located on the WhyNot? platform .
All entries must be received by 6pm on Friday, March 27, 2020 (AEDT) and entry is restricted to one per person.
4. To participate in this competition, entrants must write, compose, film, record, photograph or illustrate a feature piece responding to the set competition question or topic.
Entries need to adhere to WhyNot? Submission Guidelines.
Entries must be the original work of the individual and must **not** have been published elsewhere or have won a prize in any other competition.
It is the responsibility of each entrant to ensure that no element of their entry infringes the copyright of any third party or any laws.
Entries will be judged on originality and creativity.
5. The judging panel will be comprised of representatives of the WhyNot? Editorial Committee and the National Youth Commission (hosts of the Youth Futures Summit). The judges' decision is final and no correspondence shall be entered into.
6. Copyright in all submissions to the competition remains with the respective entrants. However, in consideration of their entry to the competition, each entrant grants a worldwide, irrevocable, perpetual licence to the WhyNot? platform and the National Youth Commission to feature any or all of the submissions in any of its publications, websites and/or in any promotional material connected to this competition.



7. Late, illegible, incomplete or defaced entries will not be accepted. In addition, entries that violate WhyNot? and the National Youth Commission's editorial and community standards will not be accepted.

No responsibility can be accepted for lost entries and proof of sending will not be accepted as proof of receipt.

Entries must not be sent through agencies or third parties.

8. One overall winner and 2-4 runners-up will be chosen from all entries received and the winner will be announced on Monday, April 6 2020.
9. The overall winning entrant shall win a two-day pass to the Youth Futures Summit, plus associated travel. Assistance with flights if the entrant lives interstate, travel if the entrant lives more than 3 hours away from the event location and accommodation if the entrant lives more than 3 hours away from the event location.

The winning entrant must notify the National Youth Commission by Wednesday, April 8 2020 if they require flights and accommodation assistance.

The prize does not include travel insurance, personal expenditure or incidental costs other than where mentioned.

It is the responsibility of the prize winner to ensure they have travel insurance, valid ID for travel and obtain any necessary documents for their trip.

10. 2-4 runners-up will each win a WhyNot? merchandise pack and have their piece published by WhyNot? and the National Youth Commission, and displayed at the Youth Futures Summit over April 20-21, 2020.
11. The prizes as described are available on the date of publication.
All elements of the prizes are subject to availability, non transferable and there are no cash alternatives.
12. The winner may be asked to participate in publicity.
13. Events may occur that render the competition itself or the awarding of the prizes impossible due to reasons beyond the control of the promoter and accordingly, the promoter may at its absolute discretion vary or amend the promotion and the entrant agrees that no liability shall attach to the promoter as a result thereof.
14. WhyNot? and the National Youth Commission are responsible for the publication and adjudication of this competition. Provision of the prizes is the responsibility of Youth Development Australia.
15. Australian law applies and the exclusive jurisdiction of the Australian Courts shall prevail.
