"Textile Triage"

- Save the NATURAL fibers.
 - Save the WOVEN rugs.
- Save the QUALITY rugs.

Flood Handling Tips:

- Wand extract (Teflon).
- Rescue mats (if room).

Flood Handling Tips:

- Dry ASAP on site or get immediately to rug plant.
- Transport (plastic sheets or towels/sheets).
- Longer it is wet, the worse the damage. Hours matter.

Flood Rugs To Run From:


- Mold/dry rot.
- Severely bled rugs (esp. silk/art)
- Delaminating tufted rugs.
 - Bad restorer handling.
 - Pushy people.
 - Bad gut feeling...

Clearly Communicate and Over-Document

Only promise for you to make: to halt the damage and do your best to improve the piece.



Photos:

- Tag and back corner.
- Full view top tagged end.
- Full view bottom untagged end.
 - Side view top half.
 - Side view bottom half.

Photos:

- All damage close-ups.
- Pre-existing close-ups.
- Before and after files.

Get it in writing:

- Authorization of work.
- Realistic expectations.
 - Timeline of work.
- Payable upon completion.*
 - Storage terms/costs.

Bill right away.
ID rugs not worth the work.
Use a certified appraiser.

Copy all parties on emails.

Put in writing what is

mentioned by phone.
